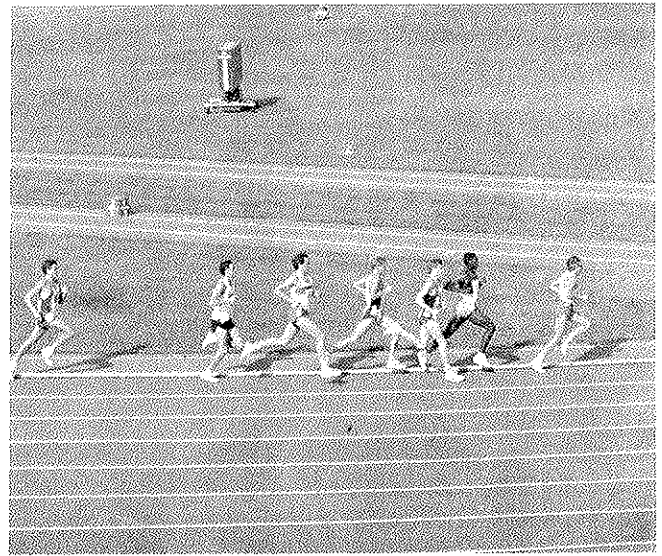

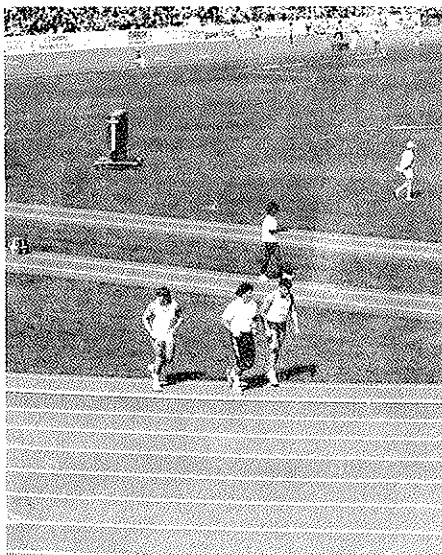
The Women's 200 Meter final, won in grand style by Florence Griffith-Joyner



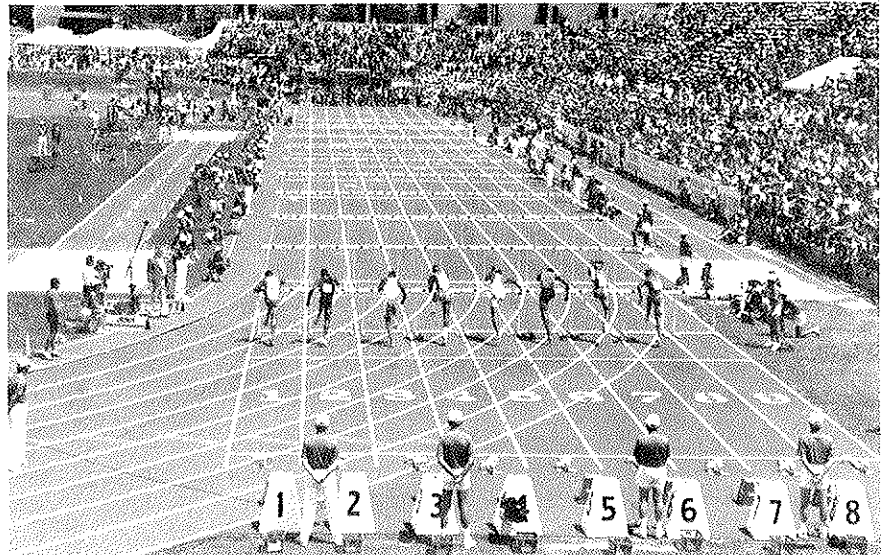
Mary Decken Slaney qualifying for Seoul

The Men's Hurdles final

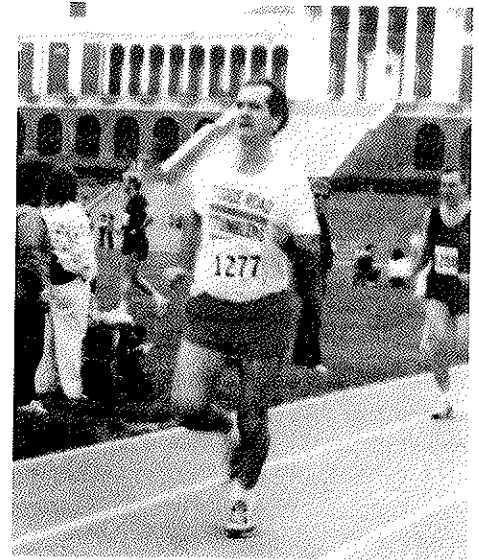
RUN U.S.A.

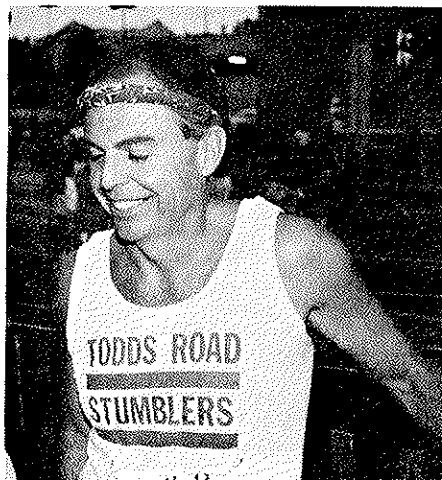
Jim Hunter was back in town on June 25th, and ran at Todds Road. Jim lives in Memphis, Tennessee.
